From Fr. Alex, our Pastor...

Many thanks and Appreciation: I was so pleased to see you all recollected and praying before the last weekend Masses as I had requested. It made a good impression upon the visitors who met with me. I appreciate you all very much for your cooperation and support to the celebration of the Eucharist in a prayerful atmosphere. Rosary and music leaders helped the congregation to enter into the right disposition for the celebration of the Holy Mass.

Probably you were surprised to hear the sound of the bell right at the start of the Mass. It was to help us rise and start singing the entrance hymn with little distraction. Gradually, we will get used to it.

Eucharistic Adoration: Our Parish is blessed to have an Adoration Chapel. It is meant for spending some time with the Lord praying and listening to him through the word of God. In the midst of all that is going on and hustle-bustle of life, Jesus is inviting us **'come to me all who labor and are burdened, I will give your rest'**. Just start with 30 minutes and then add on. In a short time, you will be able to see the blessings coming down upon you, your family and our Parish.

Many thanks and Blessings: On behalf of the parish, I extend many thanks and blessings to Sam Doellman for serving in our parish as a youth minister. I learned that he really built up the youth ministry in our parish, organizing meetings and different programs for our youth. I wish him well while invoking God's blessings upon him in his pursuit for seminary studies leading to priesthood.

World Day for Grandparents and Elderly: Pope Francis has established throughout the church the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and Elderly on the fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. The theme for this year's celebration is **"In Old Age They Will Still Bear Fruit"** (Ps. 92:15), emphasizing how grandparents are a gift both to society and the church. At all the weekend Masses, our Grandparents and the Elderly in attendance will be given special prayers and blessings towards the end of the Mass. Let us keep them in our prayers.

COVID: I hear there are some COVID cases showing up in and around the community. In order to safeguard against it, I thought I would share with you some of the precautionary measures which I promoted in my former parishes in the midst of pandemic.

Precautionary Measures are:

1. Follow steam therapy - take steam in through nostrils and let it out through mouth – reverse it and do it a few times.
2. Do gargling with salt in hot water before sleep. These are entry ways whereby the virus can enter into our body.
3. Take **vitamin c** contained fruits and veggies - such as oranges, citrus fruits, broccoli and so forth to build up the body immune system.
4. 3 slices of lemon in a glass of hot water and sip it like tea both in the morning and evening.
5. Drinking hot water is also an effective remedy to fight against this virus. I am following some of the above suggested measures promoted by some Doctors in India. Please give it a try.
