From the Pastor: Common Orientation Program: It was held on Wednesday, September 7 at 6 pm in St. Michael's Hall for the members of Pastoral Council, Finance Council, Stewardship Council, School Advisory Council and Building and Grounds Committee. It was jointly held with the Palmyra groups. Dr. Erin Vader, the Superintendent of Catholic Schools, Denise Barnes, the Director of Parish Service, Deacon Joe Braddock, the Chief Financial Officer for the Diocese, and Trish Lutz, the Associate Director of Stewardship & Planned Giving from the Chancery were the resource persons. Each of them explained the role and function of different councils. These things emerged from the talks:

1. All the councils and committees are the advisory bodies to the Pastor.
2. A person can be only in one Council or Committee.
3. No parish staff can be a member of any councils or committees but they can be called in by the Pastor to take note of the meeting proceedings.
4. Members of different Commissions cannot be members of Pastoral council.

Following each talk, time was given for clarification. It was quite enlightening and educative for all who attended it. On behalf of both the parishes, Fr. Alex thanked the Diocesan Resource Persons for their commendable free service to our parishes. Finally, he asked everyone to work toward making our parishes and school Number 1 in the diocese by taking stock of the areas where we are doing well and the areas we still need to improve. He also requested every member to pray before coming to the meeting what the Holy Spirit is telling him/her to do or contribute for the good of the Parish.

Financial Transparency: I would like to be transparent as far as possible and so decided to publish the minutes of different council and committee meetings in the bulletin. Some of the minutes have been published in the bulletin. This time we are giving out the financial status of the parish with the three-year data and the budget. This will give you a picture of our financial status.

Bishop's Decree: As instructed by the Vice Chancellor of the Diocese, we have published the decree given by Bishop McKnight describing the boundaries of our parish. You are invited to read and locate your place to see if you reside within the parish boundary or outside.

PSR Catechists Orientation: Last Sunday, September 11, a joint orientation program with Palmyra group was held in the parish Hall at Palmyra. It was given by Maureen Quinn, the Diocesan Director of Religious Education & youth/Young Adult Ministry. She focused on helping our children building relationship with Jesus by following three stages of faith journey – invitation, accompaniment and discipleship. She also presented a wonderful concept on domestic church making each family a miniature church for the children to grow in faith. It was quite informative and enlightening. On behalf of the Parish, I thank Maureen for her wonderful service to our PSR teachers.

DECREE

Declaration of Boundaries for a Parish

I, the undersigned Bishop of Jefferson City, hereby state the following in regard to the parish of

Holy Family, Hannibal:

Whereas, the formal decree establishing the parochial territory of this parish no longer exists, and there is a need to provide for an orderly record of the boundaries of this parish; and

Whereas, having received the proposal of the former Hannibal Deanery on the boundaries of this parish, and after consultation with the Presbyteral Council on 13 October 2020 in accordance with canon 515 §2;

Therefore, by this DECREE, I hereby declare that the territory of this parish shall be bounded by the following:

North – From a point on Hwy E due west from County Rd. 240 and continuing due east to intersect with Hwy 24, following Hwy 24 north to the intersecting point on Hwy 61, then following a line northeast to an intersecting point at Co.Rds. 402 and 405 and continuing east on Co.Rd 402 following a line to the Mississippi River.

South – From the intersecting point of the Mississippi River and the southern Ralls Co. line following southwest along the county line to the intersecting point of Hwy MO-F; following Hwy MO-F north and continuing on an imaginary line due north to the Salt River; following the Salt River west to a point directly south of Huntington.

East – The Mississippi River.

West – From a point on Hwy E due west from Co.Rd. 240 and following Hwy E south and continuing south on Hwy DD to the Salt River.

All things to the contrary notwithstanding.
