



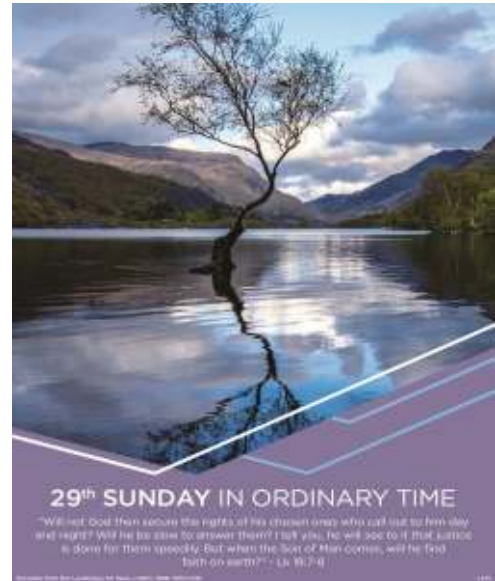

**From the Pastor, Greetings from my home Parish!****Sunday Mass at St. Joseph Church (my home Parish):**

Last Sunday, October 9, I was given a chance to celebrate the Sunday Mass in my mother tongue (Tamil) with my home parishioners. It came out quite natural. Here the entire Mass is sung which I did pretty well. I had a visiting priest from New Delhi who concelebrated and preached the homily. The Mass started at 7:15 am and ended at 8:45. Here people remain till the end and they generously give time for the Lord. People say that it would be longer if the Pastor celebrated it. He belongs to Precious Blood Congregation and is a gifted charismatic preacher.



**Some Special features of my Parish:** It is blessed with multi talents and resources. Here people run the Parish under the direction of the Pastor. The church you see in the picture is built by the generous contributions and skills of the people. The total cost of the church construction came around 5 million US Dollars. Without any debts, people completed this massive structure in three years.

Sunday catechism (PSR) classes are held before Mass starting at 6:15 am ends up at 7:10. It is compulsory for all the children from kindergarten to college regardless of the school or college (catholic or public schools) one would attend.

The Sunday Liturgy and of the weekdays is planned by individual basic Christian Community unit - the entire parish is divided into 15 units. Each unit in turn takes up a week from Sunday – Saturday for doing different roles at Mass. On Sunday, they give introduction to the Mass, read the word of God, take up collections, bring gifts, do the petitions and so forth. We have wonderful choir consists of young adults and teens led by college professors. It is all voluntary service – none of them is paid as they consider it is their selfless service to the parish. The designated unit volunteers also do the reading and singing at the weekday Masses.

School teachers of both the Parish and public schools run the PSR classes on voluntary basis. After Mass, they also run children's program, St. Aloysius Association for the teens and St. Vincent de Paul Society for young adults. These groups do a lot charitable works for the poor and the needy. They do not need any reminders or phone calls for the meeting. If someone fails to show up, individual members reach out to him/her.

At this Sunday Mass, we were three priests and one religious nun distributed Holy Communion which lasted 20 minutes. People receive Holy Communion in their hands with great reverence they believe it is the living body of Christ – no precious blood is given. During Mass, the children, the youth, and young adults sit down and kneel on the bare floor whereas the elderly people have benches without kneelers at the back of the church.

At the end of the Mass, the new Pastor has introduced a brief Eucharistic Adoration. People all kneel down and do the adoration during which the Pastor offers special prayers for the entire parish which was quite touching. I was quite moved to see the people on their knees absorbed in adoring the Eucharist Lord.

Here people put on their best dress and have their hair done when they come to Mass. You will never find casuals in dress nor in appearance whatever may be the weather. Here women and girls cover their heads when they are at Mass. This reflects on their faith life. After Mass, it took me a while to interact with the people – it is more than saying 'hi' and people do give time.



The persistent prayer of which Jesus speaks is the prayer of the heart. This contemplative, silent, loving prayer gives us the vision to see God in all things, especially in each human soul. Desiring God alone and not only what we want God to do for us places this love relationship foremost in our minds, hearts, and souls. As we breathe in and exhale out, the Divine Life flows. This alone can provide the strength of endurance to confront anything contrary to the truth of faith. @LPi

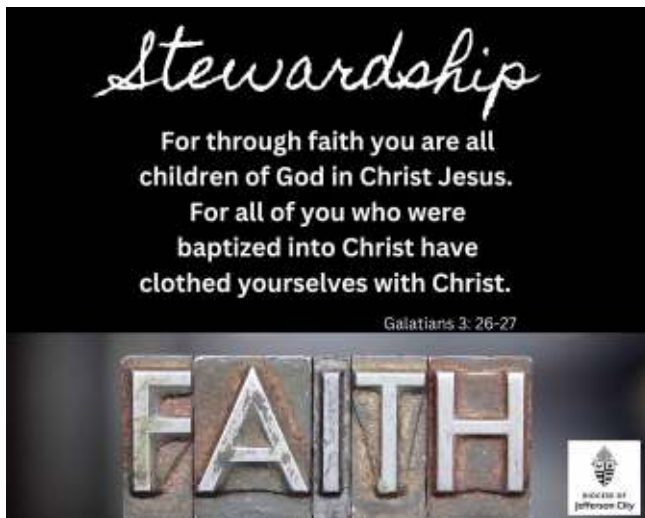
