From the Pastor:

Eucharistic Renewal: In response to a 2019 Pew Study that showed only 30 percent of Catholics believe in the Real Presence, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops launched a three-year long [Eucharistic Revival](#), which started on the Feast of Corpus Christi June 19, 2021. Each diocese and parish within the diocese is called to work toward Eucharistic Renewal. In this process, I have contacted **Tim Francis** who has collection of authentic Eucharistic miracles. His video presentation with commentaries last for a couple of hours and these two hours fly by. **He has agreed to give two presentations on Sunday, February 5 - one at 11 am in St. Joseph Church Palmyra and the other one at 4 pm in our Church. On February 6, Monday, he will have a presentation at 1 pm for our school children and one more at 6 pm for the people in the Church.** Please keep these dates marked in your calendar and attend any of the three presentations except the one for the school children. There will be promotional materials coming out both in the bulletin and on the parish website. Tim Francis' presentation is quite powerful and I have had him in previous parishes and he was received very well. His ministry is supported **by free will offering** and so there will be baskets passed around for free will offering. Reminders: 1. Liturgical Ministers: The servers, the lector, and the Eucharistic Ministers will gather in the sacristy to receive a blessing 5 minutes before every Weekend Mass. Please remember the Eucharistic Ministers who did not receive blessing do not walk up to the sanctuary to distribute Holy Communion.

2. Greeters: It is an important role that you all play. You are the face of the church, please be welcoming by not only letting people in but also saying a word of welcome. There may be new faces coming into every Mass. Your gesture of welcome will carry a good image of our parish home. Please remember to hand out the bulletin as well wishing everybody well.

Observations: I have noticed for a while after 7:30 am Mass, there was nobody at the door to give out the bulletin but found placed on the table at the back of the church. This is not way it should be done. The persons who have been the Greeters are expected to hand out the bulletin as well.

3. Ushers: You are not only called to take up collections, but also take a count on the number of people in attendance at weekend Masses and mark it in the register kept in the sacristy. Because the report has to be sent to the Diocese every month.

Observations: Again, I have noticed for a while that after 7:30 am Mass, the number of people in attendance at Mass was not recorded in the register.

Youth Minister/DRE: I would like to inform you that **Ashley Schuster** who has been holding these two positions has decided to discontinue as full-time minister due to family commitments but would continue to be the coordinator of the core team on voluntary basis. This will be effective January 31, 2023. Meanwhile I request you to help me find a youth minister and DRE. It could be part time positions with two persons running the ministries – one for the youth and another for Religious Education.

School Auction: The School Auction has been in the school bulletin and Parish bulletin for awhile. It is an annual fund raising event organized by Home and School. Last weekend at Masses, we had announcements by Co-chairs and committee members who made an appeal to all for cooperation and support. As I have said before that Parish is running the school with the generous weekly contributions and other individual donations. 80% of what we get by way of contributions goes into salary support and utilities. In addition, we have to take care of the maintenance of the old building. So such fund raising does become a very big support. Last year we spent \$5200.00 to educate a child in our school. When enrollment is greater, the amount will be less. In the new school year, my target is to make it from 150 - 200. For this we need to collectively promote a positive picture of the school in the community and media.

Please continue to remember Fr. John Groner in your prayers. He died in Westphalia on January 6th at the age of 78. He was the Pastor of our church from July 15, 1993 – July 1, 1998. The visitation will be held on January 16, Monday from 9:30 to 10:45 am with the Mass to follow at 11 am at Immaculate Conception Church, Jefferson City. May the Lord grant his eternal rest and comfort and consolation to his family. **His obituary is on the last page of our bulletin this weekend.**

When I was a kid, I remember the priest at Mass announcing, "The Lamb of God!" Frankly, it struck me as nonsense. I thought: Why in the world does God have a lamb? And where is this lamb?

John the Baptist sees Jesus coming toward him and announces, "Behold the lamb of God." His Jewish listeners knew what he meant. God's lamb is the thing that is sacrificed at the Jewish Passover and consumed by the participants. The lamb meant sacrifice, freedom from sin, and communion with God. The Baptist is saying in effect, "This man will be ritually sacrificed and consumed so that God's people may be free from sin and united to God."

It's crucial to relate to Jesus as a friend, brother, teacher, and Lord of our lives. But we should also learn to interact with Him as our lamb of God. That means we intentionally place on him our sins, sadnesses, and hopes, and offer him to God. Then we consume him to make us free. This is what we do at every Mass. That's why he is the Lamb of God. - *Father John Muir*

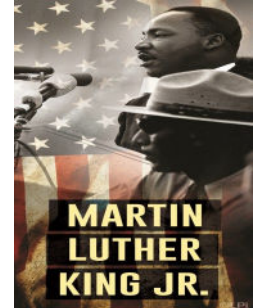

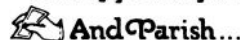

REVEREND JOHN WILLIAM GRONER

Retired Priest of the Diocese of Jefferson City

Father John W. Groner was born on January 3, 1945, in Jefferson City, Missouri, the son of the late John H. and Lydia H. (Westerman) Groner. He is survived by one brother, Bernard Groner. He is also survived by a nephew, Father Eric M. Groner, SVD, a priest of the Society of the Divine Word, eight other nieces and nephews, and his brother priests. He was preceded in death by three brothers, Richard Groner, Henry Groner and Robert Groner; and an uncle, Monsignor Bernard S. Groner, who also served in the Diocese of Jefferson City.

Father Groner attended Immaculate Conception School in Jefferson City from 1951-1959 and attended Helias Catholic High School in Jefferson City from 1959-1961. He then entered St. Thomas Aquinas Preparatory Seminary in Hannibal from 1961-1963 and Immaculate Conception Seminary College in Conception, Missouri from 1963-1971. Father Groner received a Bachelor's degree in Philosophy with a minor in Social Studies in 1967 and received his Master's degree in 1971. He was ordained to the Holy Priesthood of Jesus Christ on Pentecost Sunday, May 30, 1971 by Most Reverend Michael F. McAuliffe at Immaculate Conception Church in Jefferson City.

- Director of Peru Mission Office and Director of the Propagation of the Faith, January 1, 1983-January 16, 1986
- Pastor, Holy Family Church, Freeburg, January 1986-July 15, 1993
- Pastor, Holy Family Church, Hannibal, July 15, 1993-July 1, 1998**
- Pastor, St. Brendan Church, Mexico, July 1, 1998-June 30, 2000
- Pastor, St. Robert Bellarmine Church, St. Robert and St. Jude Church, Richland, June 30, 2000-2021
- Pastor, St. Theresa Church, Dixon and St. Cornelius Church, Crocker, July 23, 2013-July 1, 2014
