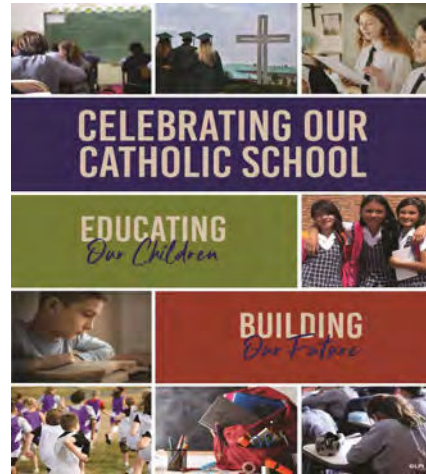

Jesus Is The Main Thing..

So the NFL season is almost over. Only the Super Bowl remains. For some fans, the season is already over since their team is now sitting at home. It is amazing the allegiance some people have to their teams. Some people bleed Green Bay green and yellow or believe the only team is supposedly America's team, the Dallas Cowboys. Of course, if you are reading this outside the States, perhaps you live and breathe a team like the New Zealand All Blacks or the Calgary Flames.

In the early church, people took their allegiance to certain leaders to an extreme. Paul chastised them for thinking that the baptism of one community or the teachings of a certain leader were superior to the anything else in this new movement of Jesus followers. He reminded them that there is to be no division in Christ and that all things flow from Christ, not from the leaders in the community. Those who follow Jesus are one body of Christ: a place where there is no room for competition or condescension.

Sometime our stewardship efforts in a parish become all about the parish. We seek to get people to do more stuff and give more money and we lose sight of why we live a stewardship way of life in the first place: Jesus. It is wonderful to watch our parishes grow into more vibrant communities that lead people to Jesus. We should rejoice to be in such a parish family. But one day there will be no parishes and those who have received his gifts freely and have followed him will live with Christ as one forever. In your stewardship, always keep Jesus as *the main thing*. @LPi

CCW (Council of Catholic Women)

Holy Family parish is sustained and supported by multiple organizations which live out our Parish mission as disciples of Christ. All women of Holy Family parish are considered members and are invited to participate in our various activities that support and promote spirituality, service and socialization. If able to pay, dues are \$10 annually.

Our largest fundraising effort is CCW Soup Day held the last Friday in October. About 100 members of our parish are typically involved by donating their time, talent and treasure from set up through cleanup. Many parishioners make baked goods or craft items for the Country Store or donate a dessert for the meal. This creates involvement of parishioners and opens our parish to the community by serving approximately 400 people for lunch and dinner.

In addition, CCW sponsors or provides receptions for Confirmation, graduation and OCIA. Our members also provide food and serve for a Loaves and Fishes meal in August.

An important and appreciated function of CCW is to serve funeral dinners for bereaved families of our parish. Nearly 200 women provide this much needed service to our parish family. Monetary contributions are accepted to assist in purchasing the main dish, but all other food is provided by volunteers.

CCW provides monetary donations to support other activities, including the school auction, mitten tree, Heavenly Dusters, youth group, Good Neighbor, Adopt-A-Family and altar expenses. CCW pays for trash pickup at the parish center and recently purchased the rugs at the church entrances and a new ice machine at the parish center, among other items through the years.

We gather on the second Monday of each month in the Parish Center at 6:30, except January and July. In April, we replace our meeting with a fun night of BINGO in St. Michael's Hall where anyone is welcome to win the multitude of prizes offered that evening at no cost to participants. We are treated to Christmas songs sung by Holy Family students in December. Our meetings are mostly for informational purposes, with no obligation for any attendees. For those who wish to come early, we pray the Rosary at 6 p.m. Hostesses provide wonderful refreshments that typically replace your evening meal.
