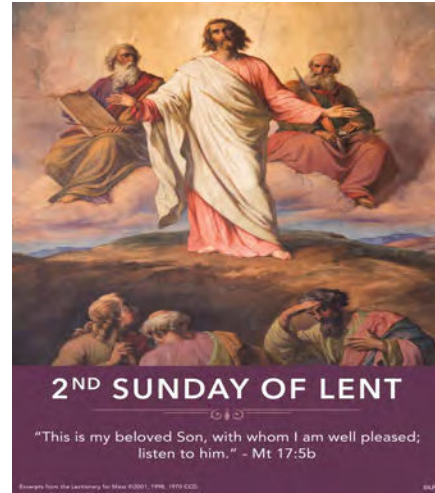

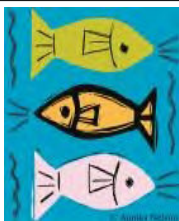

Catherine Doherty said, "Yes, stewardship pertains to everything and I am responsible for my part of that everything." I am reminded of that quote when I read the words from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy, "Beloved: Bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." Both point to our own responsibility as a disciple, as well as the reality that we are not alone. We live with God in community. We each have our part to play in the kingdom of God.

Lent is an important time to focus on how our stewardship way of life causes us to sacrifice and, at times, experience hardship. Is there someone to visit a few times before Easter than can no longer get out? Whatever it is, the strength will come from God to take greater care of your part of his everything.

**Holy Family Cancer and Cancer Caregiver Support Group**

March is Kidney Cancer support month. This is one of the most common cancers in the United States. The American Cancer Society's most recent estimates for Kidney Cancer in the United States for 2026 are: about 80,450 new cases of kidney cancer, of which about 50,770 men and 29,680 women, will be diagnosed. About 15,160 will die from this disease, 9,450 men and 4,960 women. 9 out of 10 are renal cell carcinoma. 2 to 1 men over women. Average age 64. Risks for this cancer include older age, smoking, obesity, high blood pressure, long term dialysis, and family history.

Symptoms to be aware of include blood in your urine which may appear red, pink or cola colored. Pain in your back or side that does not go away. Loss of appetite. Unexplained Weight loss. Fatigue. Fever.

There are 4 stages with Kidney Cancer. Stage 1 the cancer is confined to the kidney. Stage 2 the cancer has grown but is still confined to the kidney. Stage 3 the cancer has spread to nearby lymph nodes. Stage 4 the cancer has spread to distant organs of the body.

One of the team members' mother was diagnosed with Kidney Cancer. She lived 16 years after treatment and remission. She became a prayer warrior during this time. She had such a trust that God was in control. "I think her attitude helped to beat the cancer and have 13 more years of seeing grandkids graduate and marry."
